The morning session saw a momentous announcement: ten years after the horrors and challenges of Spindles Farm and HRH's The Princess Royal's subsequent call for a united protocol and approach, the Equine Sector Council (for health and welfare) has merged with the British Horse Industry Confederation to form the new British Horse Council. This represents the final step in bringing all aspects of the equestrian community and industries together, to seek consensus wherever it exists, so that the Equine Sector can speak to government with one powerful voice.

Ours is a sector worth £8b to the UK's annual GDP and covers interests as broad as racing, sport, breeding, veterinary excellence, trade, research, welfare, enforcement, leisure riding and education. In the past, the sector operated through a series of committees as well as individual organisations and we have now achieved a streamlined, more effective and efficient way for all equine related organisations to pull together and speak to government for the benefit of all of these interests and most importantly, for the benefit of the UK's horses, ponies and donkeys.

Chief Constable Dave Jones is the National Police Chiefs Council (NPCC) lead for Wildlife Crime and Rural Affairs. In development at this time is the first national strategy to tackle rural crime. National engagement events with police and key rural partner have helped shape an understanding for the police of the areas of focus that are required to improve the lives of our rural communities. Analysis conducted identified a number of rural crime priorities which has contributed to the on-going development of the NPCC Rural Affairs Strategy 2018-2021, which is aimed to be agreed by all Chief Constables in Spring 2018. This work has a focus on raising awareness, with the aim to reduce equine related crime. Tackling tack theft, promoting rider safety on our roads and encouraging responsible dog ownership around livestock and horses is some of the work police and partners are working together on to improve the lives of the equestrian community.

Heavy Horses



- Three breeds of heavy horses native to the UK- Suffolk, Shire and Clydesdale.
- All three are falling in numbers.
- RBST need to collect from 66 stallions to ensure they are safe from extinction.
- Raised £20,000, but we need £300,000 more.





Our Heavy Horses



Suffolk

- Oldest breed of heavy horse to exist in its present form.
- İmmersely strong and an ideal horse for working the land or carting goods.



Shire

- Before machinery, Shires were essential for the face.
- Also a familiar sight in the towns and oties where it was used by hauliers and breweries.



Clydesdale

 At its peak, Scotland had around 140,000 farm horses plus an unknown number in towns and cities, most of which were Clydesdales in whole or part.

It is over a decade since the launch of the Emergency Services Protocol, a joint initiative by the British Equine Veterinary Association and British Horse Society, in response to calls for improved knowledge and understanding of equine incidents by the fire and rescue service. This pivotal moment has led to an enviable position whereby 90% of the UK fire authorities have a large animal rescue team and the British Animal Rescue and Trauma Care Association supports the development of training and procedures for veterinarians and agencies such as Highways England who deal with equine related incidents on the strategic road networks. Jim Green, key visionary for a joined up multi agency approach to resolving equine rescues will deliver insight to the drivers for change and challenges for the future.
